





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Children, young people, vulnerability for COVID-19*

The nature and extent of the impact depend on several vulnerability factors:

- the developmental age, educational status, pre-existing mental health condition, being economically underprivileged or being quarantined due to infection /fear of infection.
- Young children show clinginess, disturbed sleep, nightmares, poor appetite, inattentiveness, and separation problems.


C&YP are more vulnerable than adults during the pandemic*

• Immature cognitive and emotional regulation systems


Tend to show more negative psychological outcomes

Anxiety, -18% in adults, 22% in Children & Adolescents in China








Children's difficulties during COVID-19

Huixi Dong 1*, Fangru Yang 1, Xiaozi Lu 2 and Wei Hao 3

- 2.68% addictive Internet user, 33.37% problematic Internet users
- Internet usage grown during the COVID-19 epidemic (both frequency, duration and stay-up Internet)
- Female*, age, depression, and stress, were correlated with the IA

*14 years, girl, cultural divide from parents, sleep disturbance, grades went down...




Fig. 2. Collision of obesity and COVID-19 pandemics.

Focus on the vulnerable*

- Gaming,-an unhealthy coping mechanism among the vulnerable
- Post-pandemic persistence of excessive gaming and resultant negative consequences.
- Vulnerable groups, require the mental health care during the pandemic.
- Early identification and help overcome the mental health challenges








Figure 2. Telepsychiatry collaborative care model.


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young people's views On their role during the pandemic *...






Figure 1. Cooperative model of psychological services provision to children and adolescents.



'Triage-model' to prioritize essential services during COVID-19

- Category 'A': Need to attend the clinical services without which may face health complications, e.g. children receiving anti-epileptic medication
- Category 'B': May choose to attend or postpone, the decision left with parents, e.g. children receiving neuroleptic medication.
- Category 'C': Advised to come in Sep. 2020 for follow-up


