Urgent need to focus on preventive public health measures

At Shanti Ashram and the International Center for Child and Public Health, we decided to look out for our most vulnerable children and women in our service villages across rural India. We aim to support their care in their homes, in the warmth of their families as well as in local community settings.

The **focus** of creating this social safety net will include **three important dimensions**:

 Facilitating critical Public Health Education on COVID 19 prevention & extension of PPE kits.

 Extension of child health services as the lock-down continues to affect access to health services in low socio economic communities.

O3 Ensuring food security for the most vulnerable children with local rural women entrepreneurs

THE BENEFICIARIES: WHO WILL WE SERVE?

Informed disease prevention and control requires epidemiological knowledge of the disease, multifaceted causation, sources of infection and dynamics of transition. Frequently it may be necessary to identify and institute more than one method of reaching out to vulnerable children simultaneously as the impact of the current COVID 19 Pandemic has been multi-dimensional. The inclusion criteria will include children living with:

- Mother headed families
- Families living with HIV
- Living in extreme poverty
- Families cared for by grandparents in the absence of 3 ving or deceased) parents

During these past one hundred days and more of the COVID 19 Pandemic, we have often spoken about despair, disease and death. A virus invisible to the naked eye with the power to disrupt daily life and global affairs at such a scale - this is indeed a public health crisis. The data is there for us to gauge the extent of the pandemic.

John Maxwell said, "Leadership is not about titles, positions, or flowcharts. It is about one life influencing another". These past two months, we saw this spirit amongst the young volunteers and child representatives of Shanti Ashram. There was a surge in the spirit of volunteering and the desire to be part of something constructive, something useful. They talked amongst themselves, developed some creative ideas to serve the community, were willing partners with adults in community service, participating in interfaith prayers, sharing knowledge updates, and supporting with technology adoption in maximising outreach.

Our YOUNG VOLUNTEERS and CHILD REPRESENTATIVES have been living testimonies of volunteerism and creative leadership. The 'evolving capacities of children and young people' is something that has always energized the work at Shanti Ashram. 30 volunteers, girls and boys, between the age group of 11 to 31 engaged! The youngest was studying in 6th standard and the oldest was pursuing a PhD.

Initiated public health awareness on personal hygiene across 37 villages,

Organized online talent sharing connecting over 300 children from 10 cities

Created content in the form of short videos, posters and reflections for the global community

Supported with running the learning hub,

Reflected and represented the youth perspective in interfaith prayers & gatherings, and

Physically helped champions and workers on the frontline to ensure food security.






