Dr. Barun Sarkar is the Founding member of the Medical InterventionTeam e.V. ,Frankfurt, Germany and leads its executive board. He has also been part of the Faculty team for the Specialist training and served as a Research Associate at the Department of Otolaryngology, University of Heidelberg for Prof. Dr. Hagen Weidauer.

After high-school graduation (Abitur) at Goethe-Gymnasium in Frankfurt and compulsory military service at the German military (Bundeswehr), Dr.Sarkar studied Human Medicine at Johann-Wolfgang-Goethe-Universität Frankfurt. He has completed additional studies in the US and India. He graduated from the Prof. Dr. Rainer Klinke - Center for Neurophysiology with focus on Neuro-Physiological Signal processing.

Dr. Sarkar along with the MIT team annually visits Myanmar (Burma) for surgical treatment of vulnerable children with cleft lip and cleft palate. This is a charity mission and has been widely recognized for its quality and delivery. The MIT team has also been recognized for significant humanitarian assistance for the war affected people of Ukraine. He is also currently piloting a 'children-centered' public health partnership with Shanti Ashram's International Center for Child and Public Health & the PSG Institute for Medical Sciences and Research.
